Through the years, GPON through its CP AoR strategies and projects has ensured improved child protection in vulnerable communities in the North East. Similarly, GPON's Water Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) interventions have brought succor to a significant demography of the over 70 million people with no access to basic water services and the 114 million vulnerable people without access to basic sanitation services². GPON has also been able reach through its partnership with the Nigeria Humanitarian Fund (NHF) and the United Nations Office of Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA) a significant percentage of about 250,000 target beneficiaries in WASH support³. These are just a few of GPONs interventions amongst a plethora of projects that epitomizes the true essence of the International Day of Charity.
